FROM THE 10 FREEWAY

Exit Indian Hill Blvd. and head north
Turn right on W. Arrow Hwy. (0.2 miles)
Turn left on College Ave. (0.9 miles)
Turn right on E. 10th St.

FROM THE 10 FREEWAY EAST

Exit Towne Ave.
Turn right on Towne Ave. (0.9 miles)
Turn left on Foothill Blvd. (1.4 miles)
Turn right on Dartmouth Ave.
Turn right on E. 10th St.

FROM THE 210 FREEWAY WEST

Exit Baseline Rd.
Turn right on Baseline Rd. (0.7 miles)
Turn left on N. Mills Ave (1.0 miles)
Turn right on Foothill Blvd (0.3 miles)
Turn left on Dartmouth Ave.
Turn right on E. 10th St.

AIRPORTS

The most convenient airport to Claremont is Ontario International Airport.

Transportation from the airport to area hotels can be arranged through the telephones at the ground transportation board in the baggage claim areas. Taxi and shuttle service can also be found at these terminals.

CAMPUS LOTS

Visitor parking is available in the parking lot on the northwest corner of Dartmouth and 11th avenues and in the lot on the northeast corner of College Avenue and Eighth Street.
